Inside Out

Background

"Inside Out" was a site specific installation commissioned by the Three Rivers Arts Festival for the exhibition "By Design" curated by Katherine Talcott, Brett Yasko, and Rick Landesberg at the Three Rivers Arts Festival Gallery in Pittsburgh, PA in November 2005.

Contribution

I contributed to the design, fabrication and installation of the piece. I was joined in the tasks by my business partner Jason Morris.

Significance

The opening for the show "By Design" was included in the Pittsburgh Cultural Trust's Gallery Crawl and the opening was attended by over 800 people. This piece was the second in a series of projects that examined the use of architectural elements (in this case laser cut plate steel and plastic) placed in an unfamiliar setting (the gallery) to question our assumptions about perception and optics. The piece was perilously installed near the entrance to the gallery and became a dividing line for viewers of the exhibition.
